

CONCEPT: CARCINOGENS

- Cancer begins with _____ in the DNA of a cell
 - **Carcinogens** are substances that induce DNA damage which can lead to cancer
 - **Tumor initiators** are carcinogens that damage DNA directly
 - **Tumor promoters** don't cause mutations, but promote cancer in already mutated DNA

EXAMPLE:



- DNA damage includes
 - Loss of DNA damage repair systems
 - Telomere shortening
 - Viral genome integration
- Environmental factors can induce DNA damage
 - Tobacco
 - Viral exposure (HPV, HBV, HCV, etc..)
 - Diet and lifestyle choices
