◆ Recall: A suffix adds to the end of a word and modifies its meaning.

◆ Commonly used suffixes can be:

• **General Use:** Common terms likely to be encountered.

• **Grammatical:** Convert a word root into \_\_\_\_\_\_, adjective, or diminutive form.

• Pathological Conditions: Describe conditions such as \_\_\_\_\_\_, inflammation, etc.

• Diagnostic & Surgical Procedures: Describe procedures such as incision, measurement, etc.

Example: -tomy = incision
