



**TOPIC: CONJUNCTIVITIS**

- ◆ **Conjunctivitis (red eye/pinkeye):** inflammation of the *conjunctiva*; can be either \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_.
- **Conjunctiva:** mucous membrane covering the front of the \_\_\_\_\_ & inside of the eyelids.

<b>Viral Conjunctivitis</b>  <span style="background-color: #ADD8E6; padding: 2px;">Watery discharge</span>	<b>Bacterial Conjunctivitis</b>  <span style="background-color: #90EE90; padding: 2px;">Mucopurulent discharge</span>
Usually caused by <i>adenoviruses</i> (can also cause respiratory infections) or <i>herpes</i> viruses.	Usually caused by <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> ; can also be caused by pseudomonads.
Causes a _____ discharge.	Causes a _____, green/yellow, mucus/pus-like discharge.
Discharge does not affect eyelids.	Eyelids often feel “stuck shut” due to discharge.
No specific treatment; usually resolves on its own.	Can be treated with antibacterial eye drops.
